I have spent over 16 years working with families and individuals who have been harmed by Purdue Pharma. This also includes my family.

I was one of the 18 who testified at the Purdue sentencing in Abingdon Virginia in 2007.

I founded Learn to Cope in 2004 and have led this network locally and Nationally ever since. We are a network with chapters all over Massachusetts and our membership exceeds 11,000.

Learn to Cope is working to help individuals and families submit claims. There are many who have been harmed by Purdue Pharma who have not yet submitted claims.

We know that with the disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic this adds further hardship for people to submit their claims by June 30th.

With social distancing in place and the current stay at home measures in Massachusetts many people will not have the opportunity to attend meetings and events to learn about the claims filing process.
